## WRL and William & Mary Libraries Initiative "One Book One Community" Returns with Author Eric Klinenberg

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (Jan. 24, 2022) – Williamsburg Regional Library and William & Mary Libraries are once again partnering for One Book One Community, an initiative that brings the community together for shared experiences related to a socially relevant book. This year's book selection is *Palaces for the People* by Eric Klinenberg.

One Book One Community is a collaborative community reading project hosted by Williamsburg Regional Library and William & Mary Libraries, with additional funding provided by the Friends of the Williamsburg Regional Library Foundation.

One Book One Community events this year will include lectures, group discussions, a panel discussion, and other activities and events related to the book theme, culminating in a visit by Klinenberg on February 24. Named one of the best books of the year by NPR and longlisted for the Andrew Carnegie Medal for Excellence in Nonfiction, *Palaces for the People* examines how the places where we meet – schools, libraries, playgrounds – create social bonds that strengthen communities.

"Eric Klinenberg offers readers a vision of how to move beyond the current climate of divisiveness and social isolation by embracing the importance of shared public spaces," said Betsy Fowler, Williamsburg Regional Library director. "This year's One Book One Community events will help our community explore the critical role social infrastructure plays in our everyday lives."

The event series kicks off on February 2 with popular WHRO radio host Barbara Hamm Lee (*Another View*), who will moderate a panel of special guests as they discuss ways people with opposing views can maintain civil dialogue while fully participating in a democratic society.

Other notable events in the series include a talk about community gardening led by the Williamsburg Community Growers, as well as several book discussions centered on *Palaces for the People*.

Author Eric Klinenberg will give the keynote presentation at 6:30 p.m. on February 24 at the Williamsburg Library.

"A library is an excellent example of the type of public spaces that are so important to bringing people together in the way that Klinenberg describes, so what better place than a library to host community discussions on the topic," said Carrie Cooper, dean of university libraries at William & Mary. "We are honored to welcome Eric Klinenberg in February and to offer the community an opportunity to hear more about his important research."
