WRL Debuts New Public Creating Space and Tools

WILLIAMSBURG, Va. (March 3, 2022) – Williamsburg Regional Library (WRL) welcomes members of the community to explore their creativity through its new Makerspace and mobile Digital Memory Lab in the Williamsburg Library.

The Makerspace is a room within the Williamsburg Library that holds 3D printers, a Glowforge 3D laser printer, Cricut machines, and sewing machines. During open hours, users can bring their own materials and do custom projects. WRL has a limited amount of material for practice; library staff will help teach users how to operate the tools. Open hours for this space will be 2 pm to 6 pm Monday through Thursday, and 1 pm to 5 pm on Sunday.

The Digital Memory Lab is a do-it-yourself mobile lab for digitizing various audio/visual media formats including VHS, photos, documents, and slides. Users will have access to knowledgeable library staff as well as instructions on how to use the equipment. The Digital Memory Lab can move to various rooms within the Williamsburg Library. "We are so excited to be able to offer this new creative space as well as state-of-the-art technology and tools to the public," said Williamsburg Regional Library Director Betsy Fowler. "Libraries have become a place to experience hands-on learning activities for all ages."

Both the Makerspace and the Digital Memory Lab are limited to users ages 13 and up and are available to any guest, regardless of whether they have a library card.
