Longtime fans of the series will recognize some familiar faces among the fall line-up as well as some newcomers to the program. Haas believes that the unique charms of the venue offer performers and audience members a one-of-a-kind experience that continues to attract artists.

"We are unique in that we have a theater attached to one of our library buildings," Haas said. "We hear a lot from performers that it's a great place to play because it's large enough to create a level of energy in the audience but intimate enough that you feel like you're right there with the performer. There's not a bad seat in the house."
